**Feinstein:** Amendment to strike the repeal of the prohibition on research and development of low-yield nuclear weapons. FAILED (tabled\*) 51-43

**Warner:** Amendment that would require the President to secure Congressional authorization and appropriation prior to the development of new, low yield nuclear weapons. PASSED 59-38.

**Dorgan:** Amendment to prohibit the use of funds for a nuclear earth penetrator weapon (RNEP). FAILED (tabled\*) 56-41

\* Tabling an amendment is a procedural device frequently used in the Senate to block or stop an amendment. The votes for the Feinstein and Dorgan amendments were actually cast on tabling the amendment. However, for the purpose of clarity, we changed the votes to express a Senator's view of the original amendments.
