ADVOCACY CORPS

The Advocacy Corps are organizers across the country will be trained and supported by FCNL staff to achieve real policy goals and make concrete change. The program is open to young adults ages 19-30, who will work 25 to 35 hours a month between August 2020 and May 2021. **Over this period, participants will receive a stipend totaling \$3,000 for successful work.**

Advocacy Corps organizers will:

- » Coordinate constituent lobby visits with local congressional offices.
- » Write letters to the editor and train others to engage with the media.
- » Participate in monthly conference calls with other organizers.
- » Attend FCNL's Annual Meeting (November 2020) and Spring Lobby Weekend (March 2021) in Washington, D.C. *Travel and housing provided.*

YOUR TRAINING

The Washington Summer Intensive Training takes place in Washington, D.C. from July 31 to August 9, 2020. *Travel, food, and housing will be provided.*

Participants will be trained in:

- » Media and communications
- » Lobbying across identity divides
- » Community solidarity and mobilization
- » Captivating narrative and storytelling
