Thank you for applying for FCNL's summer internship program and for the work you put into your application. Unfortunately, due to the impact and uncertainties around the Covid-19 pandemic, FCNL has reached the difficult decision that we are unable to offer summer internship positions in 2020. We expect to resume the program for the summer of 2021.

One of my greatest joys at FCNL is when hardworking, empathetic people like yourselves bring their talents to our office in the summer. I sincerely regret that we will not have you with us this year. I hope you will stay in touch and stay involved in advocacy for peace and justice.

I want to encourage you particularly to apply for our [Advocacy Corps](#), which we do expect to run in 2020-21. Advocacy Corps organizers work for 10 months in their communities to advocate for immigration reforms. You'll get paid a stipend of \$300 per month to connect local activists and leaders with their members of Congress to affect big, long-term change. Applications for the upcoming Corps are due by April 24.
