



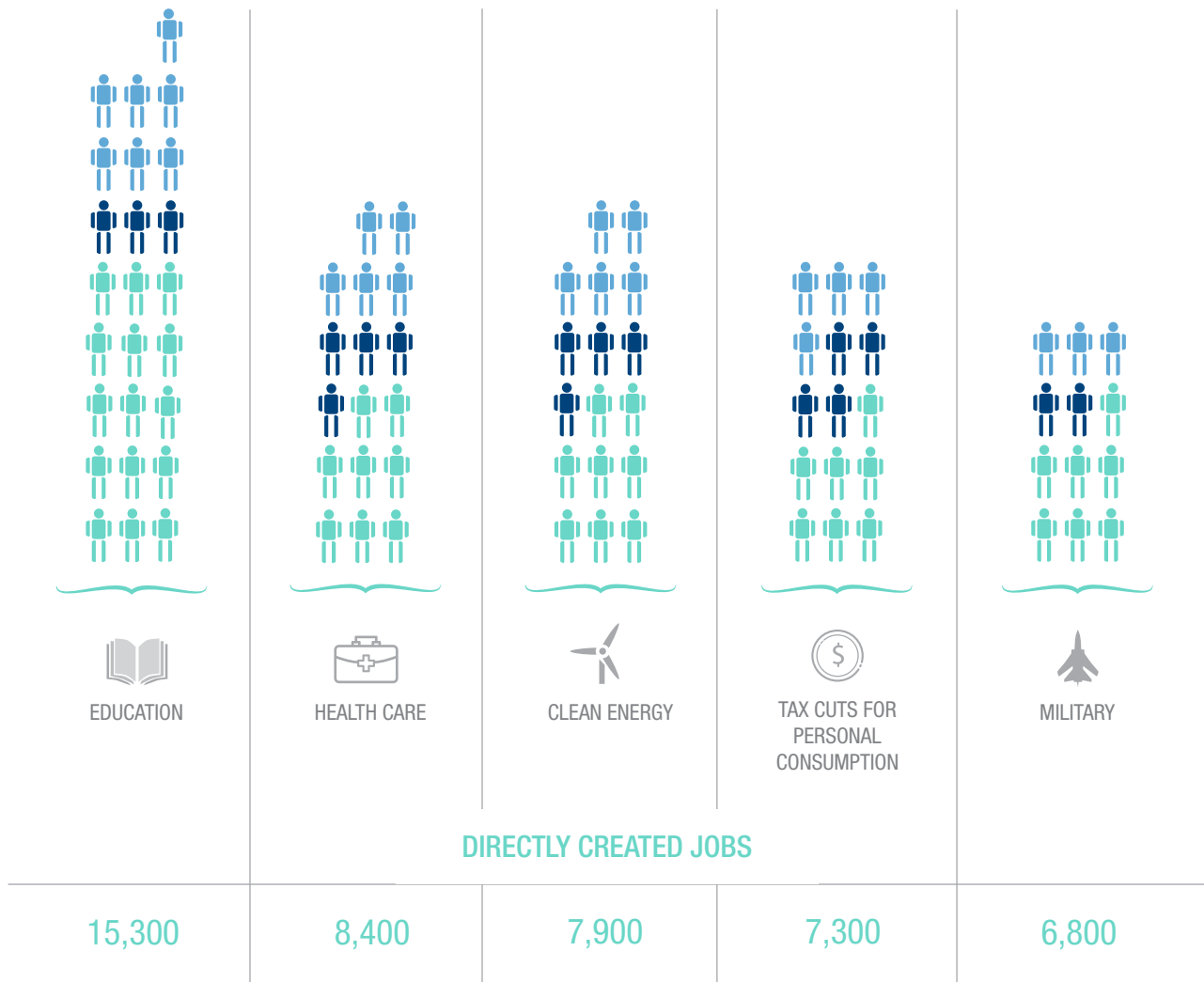




PENTAGON SPENDING IS THE LEAST EFFECTIVE WAY TO CREATE JOBS

Dollar for dollar, military spending is less effective at creating jobs than four other options, according to Brown University's study *The Job Opportunity Cost of War*. \$1 billion invested in education will create twice as many jobs as \$1 billion invested in the military. If members of Congress want to create American jobs, then this study suggests they should be taking money out of the military, not putting more into it.

-  **DIRECT:** Directly created by industry
 -  **INDIRECT:** Created through the supply chain (ex. jobs in military uniform production)
 -  **INDUCED:** Domestic jobs created as industry and supply chain workers spend their paychecks
-  = 1,000 jobs
